Youth Exchange

05.05 – 13.05.2019

(arrival on 05.05, departure on 13.05)

Basic information:

Activity dates: 05.05 – 13.05.2019 (arrival on 5th afternoon, departure on 13th morning)

Location: Oradea, Judetul Bihor, Romania

Participating countries: Poland, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Romania

Number of participants: 6 participants (18-24) + 1 leader (no age limit) → total of 28 participants

Project details:

The theme of the project is active citizenship and voting on the elections. Within the project young people will have the opportunity to acquire knowledge about the European Union, the structure and functioning of the European Parliament, the way in which the elections are



carried out, participants will develop their communication skills, decision-making skills and taking initiatives and critical thinking skills through a series of non-formal activities.

The youth exchange will have activities like interactive presentations, creative workshops, situation games, simulation games, creating promotional/informational materials, meeting with citizens, evaluation sessions, intercultural evenings.

Objectives of the youth exchange:

- Increasing the knowledge of 28 young people from 4 countries on the importance of voting.
- Increase the knowledge of 28 young people from 4 countries, about the EP and its functions.
- Develop critical thinking skills of 28 young people from 4 countries as an important element of democracy
- Increasing the knowledge of 28 young people from 4 countries on the Erasmus + program and the opportunities it offers.

Accommodation:

The location of the project will be Oradea, at a hotel called Gala hotel. The location of the project has a conference room, dining room, a terrace and cellar. (<https://www.galahotel.ro/>)





Financial conditions:

The participants will have to bring with them all of their original tickets, receipts and boarding passes and copies of their travel documents (passports, identity cards) as we will collect all of them at the end of the youth exchange. In addition, participants are required to send us by post all of their original return tickets, receipts and boarding passes within 1 week of their departure from the youth exchange otherwise, we will not be able to refund them. **Please keep in mind, that without the original tickets, receipts and boarding passes, we cannot reimburse your money!**

IMPORTANT! In case a group wants to arrange some extra travelling before or after the project, please remember that the travel must be organized within maximum 2 days before and 2 days after the end of the project, according to the Erasmus+ Program Guide!

Currency

The Romanian currency is RON, and 1 Euro is approximately 4,65 RON.



Weather conditions:

Capital: Bucharest (Bucuresti)

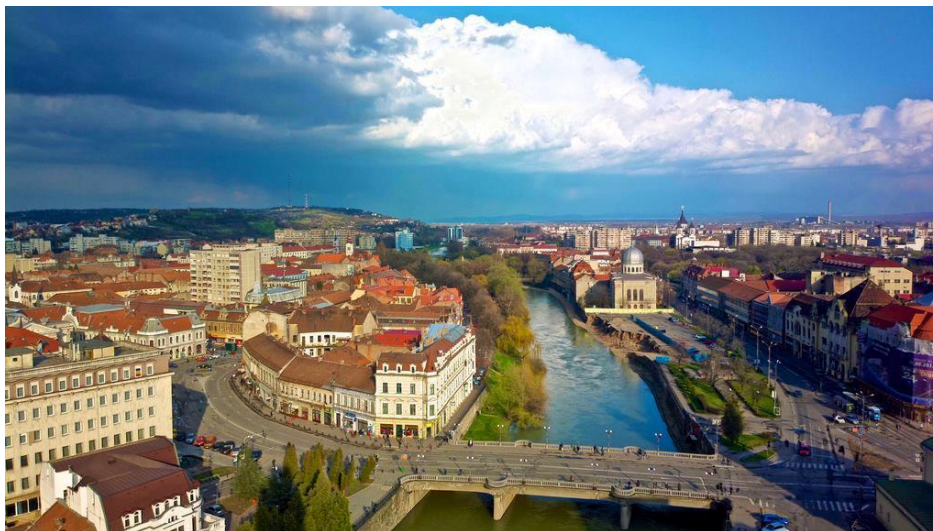
Form of State: Semi-parliamentary Republic with two legislative bodies: Senate (Senat) and Chamber of Representatives (Camera Deputatilor)
